### Seed Pot DECORATION

#### How to...

1. Use a chopping board and a biro or something similar to pierce around 3 holes in the bottom of your container.
2. Decorate your pot using paints, stickers, glitter and glue or anything you want to. Let your creativity go wild!
3. Once your decorated pot is ready and dry, you can pop your soil in. Leave a few cms of pot above your soil.
4. Next is to put your seeds and a thin layer of soil on top. (Make sure you go by what it says on your seed packet with regards to how far apart you put your seeds and how much soil you put on top once they are in there.)
5. Either sit your container in some water, or pour a little into the top.
6. Place your sandwich bag over the top of the container and secure with a rubber band.
7. Wait for your seedlings to sprout and once they have, you can take the bag off and enjoy watching them grow. (Depending on what you have decided to grow, you may need to pot seedlings into bigger containers once they get too big for their pot.)



#### You will need:

- Yoghurt pot (empty and cleaned) or a disposable coffee cup (empty and cleaned) or anything you can hold soil in that is vaguely waterproof that you can make holes in for drainage.
- Something to pierce holes in the bottom of the pot (e.g biro or skewer stick)
- Acrylic paints, sharpie pens, stickers, basically anything that you want to decorate your seed pot with.
- Seeds!
- Sandwich bag or some sort of plastic transparent bag (optional) to help with the germination of the seeds.
- Soil! Can be compost from a garden centre, or some soil from a garden.

TIP

Good seeds to use for this could include basil, cress, tomatoes (self determinate varieties), dill, marigolds and thyme.
